Nearly 1 in 5 people in the United States has a disability. This equates to approximately 56.7 million people.

Of that, roughly 560,000 people never leave home because of transportation issues.

Purchasing a vehicle is a big decision for anyone to make. There's the choice between new and used. The choice of model, engine, automatic or manual, color, basic features, upgraded features, cloth versus leather, the options are endless.

While it may seem that making any vehicle purchase choices would have the same amount of difficulty level, we know that when it comes to buying your first conversion van, it's always a big decision. The reason being that many people with disabilities have been getting by with their own methods of transportation for months or even years, and making the change doesn't instantly strike them as something that's necessary.

Being in a wheelchair does not mean losing all sense of independence. With the modern technology that is available in wheelchair vans, it is now easier than ever for wheelchair users to drive themselves wherever they need to go. If a person can use a wheelchair to get around, why can't he or she do the same with a wheelchair van?

Wheelchair Vans Promote Independent Living

The best part about owning a wheelchair van is regaining the freedom to come and go when it is convenient for the user. Not every wheelchair user lives in the heart of a bustling city, and many live in cities where the wheelchair accessibility of public transportation isn't very good. Others live in rural areas where there is little choice but to own a personal vehicle.



Studies show that people with special needs that have a modicum of autonomy are happier than those that depend on family members for all of their needs.

Some positive effects of living independently include:

- Increased sense of self-worth
- Better sense of economic security
- Soaring self-confidence
- Improved productivity
- Ability to socialize, make meaningful connections

Employment is also a factor, as employment rates vary by type of disability. Employment rates are highest for people with hearing (50.2%) and vision (39.6%) disabilities, and **lowest for people with self-care (15.2%) and independent living (15.3%) limitations**.

25.6% of people with disabilities report that lack of transportation is a barrier for them getting a job.

Taking a road trip is easier than ever with the use of a wheelchair accessible van. Whether it's a trip to see family or friends, or visiting a place you've never been before (like the Chicago skyline pictured above) you'll have the freedom to go whenever you want, wherever you want. Wheelchair vans eliminate the need to rely on family, friends or public transportation to get around. They also eliminate any feelings of being a burden.

Instead, wheelchair users can use their own, reliable methods of transportation to go where they want, when they want.



Wheelchair Users Can Operate Their Vans on Their Own

Wheelchair vans can be driven by many wheelchair users. There is no need to have a caregiver act as a driver, meaning wheelchair users can get around on their own. Hand controls easily allow for people who do not have the use of their lower body to operate the accelerator and brakes. These controls are just as reliable and safe to use as standard car pedals.

Wheelchair users can qualify to operate their vehicle by obtaining a driver's license through their state. From there, learning to drive a wheelchair van is easy. The controls really aren't very different from those found in standard vehicles.

Even if a person is not qualified to drive their van, they still maintain independence by being able to board and deboard the vehicle on their own. All Rollx Vans come equipped with a lift or ramp that allows wheelchair users to get in and out of the vehicle without having to get out of their chair.

When it comes to being independent, there are a few things that beat owning a personal vehicle. Wheelchair vans are safe, affordable and offer the best thing possible for a person in a wheelchair: another means to get around.

Chapter 2 Saving Time Through Efficiency

Wheelchair users understand that certain things take them a bit more time to do, but this doesn't have to be the case when using a wheelchair van to get around.



Travelling with a wheelchair is not always the easiest task. Many wheelchairs are bulky, hard to store in a trunk and it takes time to get them in and out of the car. Some larger power wheelchairs are virtually impossible to fit in many types of vehicles.

Wheelchair vans eliminate this source of anxiety, allowing people to safely and easily get in and out of their vehicle, sometimes without even having to be transferred out of their wheelchair.

Getting out of the house to see family, friends or just to run errands or have a bit of fun doesn't have to turn into a large, complicated and time-consuming production.

Wheelchair Vans are Easier and More Safe for Users

The Problem with Public Transportation for Wheelchair users.

Many studies have been conducted on the use of public transportation by people with disabilities to determine if it's an effective means of getting around.

What most people don't realize is that these studies often show the gaps in effective and time efficient transportation methods.

For example:

- Only 2 percent of taxis in New York City are wheelchair accessible. Meaning, the wait time for a wheelchair user to get a taxi in NYC is far more significant than the wait time for an able-bodied person.
- In San Francisco, the request for ramp vehicles ending in dispatch are 6 times more likely to result in a no-show (meaning their patron was never picked up).



When wheelchair users have to travel in a non-handicap accessible van, it often requires a second set of hands and a lot of work. From transferring the wheelchair user into the vehicle, stowing the chair in the back, then having to repeat the process all over again when arriving at the desired location, getting around can seem like a lot more trouble than it's worth.

Getting in and out of a wheelchair van is far easier. All the vehicles at Rollx Vans come equipped with either a ramp of a lift that can get the wheelchair user in and out of the vehicle safely and with ease. There is no need for one or more caregivers to perform a risky transfer that could result in a fall.

Time is Precious

No one likes to have their time wasted and while it may not seem like a waste of time transferring a wheelchair and its user in and out of a vehicle, it is when compared to the ease of doing so with a wheelchair van. The affordable price tags of Rollx Vans are well worth the increased independence and safety, savings of time and the decreased effort of getting around.

The independence that wheelchair vans provide to people living with disabilities is a great thing to have, but the benefits that they also provide to wheelchair users' bodies are just as great.

Getting in and out of a standard car can be taxing on a wheelchair user's body. At times, it can even be dangerous. When using a wheelchair van, the strain is taken off the person's body because the van itself does all the work.

Wheelchair Vans are Great for the Mind and Body

When boarding and deboarding a wheelchair van, users have the ability to remain seated in their chairs. While trying to get in and out of a standard vehicle generally requires the help of one or more caregivers, the ramps and lifts that are available on wheelchair vans allow for greater independence, safety and ease with entering and exiting the van.



Studies show:

Unintended patient adverse events associated with patient handling tasks include decreased resident comfort, fear, pain, damage to the shoulder from manual lifting techniques, hip fractures from dropping the patient, bruising of arms, loss of dignity during lifting procedure, increased dependency, skin tears, and pressure area damage.

The number of wheelchair related injuries treated in emergency rooms have more than doubled in the past two decades. The external cause of these injuries includes trips, falls, wheelchair transfer mishaps, and strains of body parts.

Major issues can be caused by transfers like:

- Repetitive shoulder strain injuries
- Carpal Tunnel
- Rotator Cuff Strain/ Shoulder Impingement

Watch as one of our folding ramps quickly and easily folds into and out of the van whenever it's needed. Then, wheelchair users can enter or exit the vehicle without leaving their chair. This allows them to lessen the daily strain placed on their body.

Features that Prevent Injury and Strains

Not having to transfer from a wheelchair to the seat inside of the vehicle, or having a transfer seat that comes directly to the user, eliminates the risk of falls or injuries during the entire process.

The vehicles at Rollx Vans can be modified to have seats that turn towards the user within the vehicle, helping people who shouldn't put additional strain on their bodies to safely and efficiently board the vehicle.



While inside the wheelchair van, tie-downs ensure the safety of the user by securing his or her wheelchair in place. This method of securement ensures that the passenger is comfortable and safe while the van is in motion.

A More Comfortable Way to Travel

People who use wheelchairs or other assistive devices shouldn't have to suffer from uncomfortable vehicles that can cause further harm to their bodies. With a Rollx Van, all passengers and their wheelchairs can be safe and comfortable while boarding or deboarding with the use of a ramp or lift, and during the entire ride.
